In 2007, the international neurological community is celebrating the 50th anniversary of the seminal study on “Syndrome of Acquired Aphasia with Convulsive Disorder in Children” by William L. Landau and Frank R. Kleffner. This syndrome today is known under the eponym ***Landau-Kleffner Syndrome***.

To celebrate this anniversary, an international symposium will take place in **Alden-Biesen, Belgium, from 2 to 4 November 2007**, aiming to present the state-of-the-art on acquired epileptic aphasia and related disorders, and to delineate the limits of these syndromes among childhood epileptic syndromes.

Several worldwide known clinical and fundamental scientists have been invited and have confirmed their willingness to participate in this event. Both doctors Landau and Kleffner have agreed to chair the meeting as Honorary Presidents.

The symposium will be open to a maximum of 250 paying participants (neurologists, neuropsychiatrists, neuropsychologists, speech/language pathologists, students, ...).
